Is Zion spiritual or temporal? Is the World spiritual or temporal? Rather than viewing Zion and the World as either one or the other, let us consider both elements together using the two greatest commandments and 1 John 4:20-21 as the key.

Zion through the Ages

Did the idea of Zion originate with the Restoration of the Church in 1830, or did it start before then? The first revelation of Zion within the Restoration was April 1829 (Section 6). Sections 6 through 11 use the phrase, "establish the cause of Zion," while Section 12 and 19 say, "establish my Zion" and "move the cause of Zion in mighty power for good," respectively. [Side note: What causes Zion? The Everlasting Covenant]

• Zion is mentioned 171 times in the D&C, 179 times in Old Testament, and 42 times in the book of Mormon.

Ephesians 1:9-10, Matthew 6:38 – All of history has been moving toward Zion, which is the epitome of love and joy, and the utter abolishment of pride and selfishness. It is a war that has been raging since the foundation. It started in the Garden of Eden and has continued through Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, Moses, Lehi and Nephi, they days of Christ, the Apostles, the reformation, the restoration, and in our day as well.

The Redemption of Zion

What is Zion? It is important to understand that the word "Zion" can mean different things depending on the context and content. Zion is:

- A Spiritual Condition [94:5c, Gen 7:23]
- A Holy City prepared to <u>meet</u> Jesus [Gen 7:70, Heb 11:10]
- Enoch City promised to return <u>with</u> Jesus [Gen 7:71]
- New Jerusalem [Gen 7:70, Eth 6:4-6]
- New Jerusalem that <u>comes</u> with a new heaven and new earth [Eth 6:9-10, 2 Ne 11:30-33, 3 Ne 5:92, DC 28:6, Rev 21:1-8

Genesis records God receiving Zion into His own bosom [Gen 7:23-28, 76-78], as well as the promise of Zion's return [Gen 9:21-23]. The promise concerning where Zion will return was giving July 1831 [DC 57:1a-d]. Though the Church was commanded to gather, it found itself under condemnation for treating lightly the truth which it has received [DC 83:1b-2b, 8]. Essentially, the Church was not living by the laws of the Celestial Kingdom and remains under chastisement until it learns obedience. [DC 102:1-2]. Yet, we have the promise that God will redeem Zion by power and His outstretched arm [DC 100:3] if we seek for Zion with all our heart. [DC 38:4]

What or who will return first, Zion or Jesus Christ? Does the destruction of the wicked as spoken of by Jesus occur before or after the millennial reign? In what order does Zion, the thousand years, the little season, and the new heaven and the new earth actually occur? We can find the answer to many of these questions in Genesis 7:67-75].

God's Pattern

Zionic conditions [DC 140:5c] have appeared numerous times in history, as described in the Scriptures. Each one of these testimonies [Enoch (Gen 6:26-48, 7:1-4, 12-27), Melchisedek (Gen 14:26-38, Al 10:1-15), Alma (Mos 9:37-67, 11:16-20), Alma II (Al 11:21-33), early Jerusalem Church (Acts 2:37-47, 4:24-37), and the Nephites (4 Nephi 1:1-21)] occurred through the same pattern.

Redemption of Zion

God will bring about His Zion as described in Genesis 7:67-75. This is covered in five broad topics which follow after the same pattern that God has already established.

 - e. Lamanites Restored [3 Ne 10:1-4, Eth 6:6-8, 2 Ne 12:49-51, 79-87, DC 49:5]
 - f. Gathering [Isa 11:10-12, DC 63:9a-e, DC 108:4, DC 64:5b]

3. Coming of Christ and the City of Enoch, the Millennial Reign

A Citizen in the Kingdom [DC 65:1]

What was Jesus's mission? [Luke 4:43, Luke 8:1-2, Luke 9:1-2]. We are called to seek first the Kingdom, but what is it? A kingdom is defined as "the territory or country *subject* to a king...and in Scripture, the government or universal *dominion* of God [1 Chr 29:11-12." It comes not with observation [Luke 17:20-21] and those seeking truth will press into it [Luke 16:18]. The government of the Kingdom is the Church [Isa 9:6-7]. What conditions prove that we are citizens? [Condition – DC 85:8-9, Parable – Matthew 22:11-14, Method – 2 Ne 13:16, 22-30]

Five Questions of a Member [Mosiah 9:39-41]

- 1. Desirous to come into the fold of God [Heb 10:22-25]
- 2. Willing to bear one another's burdens [Gal 6:1-2]
- 3. Willing to mourn with and comfort those in need [Rom 13:8, 10]
- 4. Willing to stand as witnesses of God [Mat 5:15-18, 2 Ne 1:71-73]
- 5. Willing to serve God and keep His commandments [Mos 1:52-58]

If we answer these questions with a sincere heart we will be fruitful in our knowledge of Jesus Christ, for we shall come unto Him [DC 90:1a, 1 John 2:3]

What are the commandments of God? What is their purpose? [Mos 1:32]. What is sin? [Mos 1:107-108] What is keeping the commandments? [1 Sam 15:22-23]

Seven Duties of a Member

- 1. Obtain God's Word [DC 10:8-10]
- 2. Know God's voice [Mos 3:11-21]
- 3. Develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ [Eth 5:41]
- 4. Present our bodies a living sacrifice [Rom 12:1-2]
- 5. Stewardship [1 Pet 4:10, DC 147:5a]
- 6. Seek to know and do God's will, God's way [DC 63:7]
- 7. Seek to establish the cause of Zion [DC 6:3]

Ultimately, the purpose of these duties is to bring souls unto Jesus Christ.

Children in the Kingdom

All members are important [1 Cor 12:12-14, 21-23] and the purpose and significance of the Kingdom has not been taught to the youth [DC 68:4]. The Church has been commanded to teach the youth [Mos 2:26-27, Al 17:66-70]. Children must seek a testimony of Christ like Melchizedek [Gen 14:26], David [1 Sam 17:24, 26, and 37], Chief Captain Moroni [Al 20:19, 132-140], Helaman's 2,000 [Al 26:100-103], and Mormon [Mor 1:1-4, 22-23].

Priesthood in the Kingdom

While each citizen of the Kingdom is essential, priesthood have a special role [DC 83:3c, Act 20:28, 1 Peter 5:2-3, Eph 4:12-16]. The purpose of priesthood is truly great, but with greater light and responsibility also comes greater condemnation if those who have been called and ordained do not fulfill their covenant of priesthood [DC 83:6g-h, Jer 23:1-2, Jer 50:6-7, Eze 34:1-2]. Priesthood must magnify their office and calling [Jac 1:19-20, DC 117:5, 135:2c]. Priesthood are called as Aaron, even as Christ was [Heb 5:4-5, Exo 4:10-15, 27-28, Exo 40:12-16].

Parables of the Kingdom

Parables are defined in Mat 13:12, 14-16, 33-34]. The Kingdom is like treasure [Mat 13:46-47], new cloth on old garments [Mat 9:15-23], salt and light of the earth [Mat 5:15-18], vigilant, faithful, and wise servant [Luke 12:44-53], house built on rock/sand [Mat 7:30-37], mustard seed [Mat 13:30-31], one [DC 38:6a]
